legislators continue to work on a variety of issues including the approval of tolls, the legalization of marijuana and the elimination of vaccination exemptions for

religious reasons.

However, our elected officials must also be made aware that retired teachers are very concerned about the funding of our pensions and health insurance, the implementation of the promised 50% tax exclusion on our pensions and the calculation of our cost of living adjustment (COLA).

As you are aware, retired teachers do not have a union. We must be our own advocates. I encourage you to write a short

note, email or phone your elected officials and make them aware of your retirement concerns.

On a lighter note, I was sent an email by a former colleague regarding the origin or phrases we sometimes use. AS rainy April approaches, I thought I would share this little bit of non-boring history.

A Very Brief History of the GBRTA

The GBRTA was established in 1951 to provide for the welfare of retired teachers. Looking back, our early history documents a number of social activities—trips, card parties, lunches in various restaurants, raffles and teas—yes, formal teas with petite sandwiches and cakes. Most of the earliest members were retired ladies. At the end of the year, funds remaining in the treasury were donated to area charities.

Before long, GBRTA members saw the need to become

A Word about the Budget

The budget runs from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. The balance forward is always a guesstimate, based on our current balance, expected expenses from now through June, and anticipated income (in large part, your dues). Certain items are fixed, such as the State corporate filing fee, ARTC dues, and the occupancy fee (for the Burroughs Center, where the board meets). The tax preparation fee (yes, we do have to file a tax return though we don’t pay taxes) and the liability insurance amounts reflect current prices. Fortunately, the budget has remained fairly consistent from year to year.

informed about and involved in legislative issues related to retired teachers' pensions and health insurance. Social activities were supplemented with increasingly necessary discussions about pensions and health insurance.

Bequests allowed our treasury to grow and the Association committed itself to providing scholarships to high school seniors in each of the public high school in our eight town area.

Keeping up with proposed changes to legislation became an almost full time job so GBRTA recognized that it needed assistance in coordinating state-wide action and became one of fourteen affiliate chapters of the Association of Retired Teachers of Connecticut (ARTC).

Since 1946 ARTC, with its 8,000 members, has spoken for Connecticut's retired teachers on issues related to protecting their pensions and health insurance benefits. In conjunction with ARTC, GBRTA participates in *Meet and Greet* sessions at the Capitol in Hartford where retired teachers meet with legislators to educate those legislators on issues of concern to retired teachers. In addition, *Connecticut Retired Teachers' Lobby Day* offers the opportunity for retired teachers to learn about proposed legislation that would affect them and then to meet with their State Legislators to discuss that legislation.

GBRTA's president serves on the Board of Directors of ARTC. GBRTA members serve on ARTC's committees. GBRTA benefits from information provided by ARTC's Lobbyist who tracks and advises on all bills related to issues of concern to retired teachers.

ARTC members present testimony, both written and in-person, to legislative committees dealing with our pension and health insurance. The GBRTA/ARTC partnership benefits each of us.


