LOBBY DAY HAS COME – AND GONE! – But the issues stressed to legislators have NOT gone away. Although several of our legislators were not in Hartford on that day, those that did meet with us emphasized the fact that the more they hear from us, the more they respond.

With over 30,000 retired teachers, if a legislator hears from a few, then the message is that the issue isn't particularly important. When legislators hear from dozens, they take notice.

At a recent meeting between some retired teachers and an area legislator, the four-term legislator commented that the retired teachers should do a better job in their negotiations!!!! And just who is our bargaining unit? This demonstrates the misunderstanding of many of our legislators as to how the CT Teacher's Retirement System works and why it is important to belong to the GBRTA and to the ARTC as both organizations work solely for retired teachers.

While we can not bargain as the active teacher organizations do, your dues help to cover the costs related to dealing with the legislators and for a full-time lobbyist to ensure that our issues are not ignored.

Send a "Thank You" Note to Bridgeport Teachers

Nearly 40 years ago, in September 1978, when Bridgeport's public school teachers and the Bridgeport Board of Education could not reach a contract settlement, the City's teachers went on strike. The Board made an offer; the teachers rejected it and negotiations were stalled. The Board refused to negotiate.

On September 6th, the first day of school, only 36 of 1,247 teachers were in the classroom. The rest were on the picket line. A permanent injunction against the Bridgeport strike was issued and fines of \$10,000 a day were levied against the union. On September 12th, the first teachers were sent to jail, beginning with the union officers. Thirteen teachers were jailed with the men sent to the New Haven Correctional Center and the women to the women's prison in Niantic. At the jails, they were fingerprinted, strip-searched, and sprayed with a delousing compound.

Eventually whole busloads of teachers would be sent to Camp Hartell, a National Guard camp in Windsor Locks which became a prison camp. More than 50 current GBRTA members were jailed. They remember the common showers, the lack of privacy, the sleep-interrupted nights, and the visits with loved ones through barbed wire fencing. In the 19 days of the strike, 274 teachers were jailed.

On Sept. 22, the union and school board agreed to use binding arbitration to settle the strike. Three days later the union and the board agreed to a two-year contract. The following year the State legislature enacted the landmark *Teacher Negotiation Act*, requiring that deadlocked teacher contract negotiations be solved through binding arbitration.

July 14, 2018 A Taste of Rhode Island \$145.



You need to know that:

- In 2006 the Legislature agreed to pay one-third of retiree health insurance costs with retirees and active teachers paying the balance. The State has paid its full share only once since the agreement was made.
- Since 2010, the Legislature has under-funded the Health Insurance Premium Account (HIPA) by \$192 million, with the Account's insolvency projected for the fall of 2018.
- To avoid the projected bankruptcy of the Account, retirees were required to enroll in a Medicare Advantage Plan or face an increased cost for the current insurance plan.
- The proposed budget for 2018-2019 continues to underfund the Account, despite increasing medical and drug costs and an increase in the number of retired teachers.
