From the President's Podium

In the midst of this busy holiday season, I hope that each of you, in your own tradition and custom, are able to pause for a moment to give thanks and in some way express appreciation for the blessings that have come your way.

As I write this, the budget battle is over and, considering the way things were going, we are probably fortunate to have maintained our 25% income tax reduction! The 50% reduction is still on the horizon (2019) and we will need to continue to advocate for that when the next round of budget adjustments occurs.

The new budget increases the pension contribution of currently employed teachers from 6% to 7% putting Connecticut about in the middle with 24 states having a higher level of contribution. Interestingly, Oregon and Utah teachers contribute nothing to their pension funds while Missouri teachers contribute 15.47%.

A date for *Retired Teachers Lobby Day* has not yet been announced but it is usually towards the end of March or the beginning of April. This is a chance to meet face to face with your legislators and advocate for our position on topics that affect our health and welfare.

As soon as the date is scheduled, we will pass that along to you. and we will arrange bus transportation for those who do not want to drive to Hartford – let's have a record turnout!

State Budget Defers 50% Exemption

With the State budget finally resolved, the 2017-2019 Connecticut budget delays, by two years, the scheduled increase in the CT Income Tax exemption on teachers' pensions. The budget bill maintains the exemption at 25% for 2017 and 2018 and increases it to 50% beginning in 2019. While the delay is disappointing, the fact that the Legislature included plans to increase the exemption in 2019 is encouraging.

Less encouraging is the reduction in the State's share of TRB retiree health costs from 33% to 25%. Previous legislation had required that the State, the Health Insurance Premium Account (HIPA) and Retirees each contribute one-third of health costs. The State's record in payment to the Health Fund has been erratic with no payments from the State in 2010 and 2011 and less than its one-third payment in five of the following six years. As a result, it has been estimated that the Health Fund will be insolvent in 2020.

Another section of the budget increases teachers mandatory

THANKS ROZ, FOR 46 YEARS OF SERVICE

In 1961, Rosalyn (Roz) Schoonmaker went to her first meeting of the Teachers' Retirement Board as a representative of active teachers. The door was locked; the TRB did not welcome teacher participation on its Board.

She persisted and became a voice for active teachers. On her retirement from the Bridgeport schools 30 years later, she was elected to represent retired teachers. On October 1, 2017, having completed 46 years of service, Roz resigned from the TRB.

Her career as a Bridgeport teacher began and ended at Barnum School, with stops along the way at four other elementary schools.

Driving from her home in Oxford to her school in Bridgeport proved challenging. Bridgeport schools rarely closed because of snow and, as Roz learned, snow in Oxford made for a treacherous drive. One snowy day she ended up in a ditch on the side of the road. She informed her principal that she would not be in school on snowy days—she would take the days as personal days.

Roz is proudest of her advocacy for teachers, particularly her championing of applying the COLA to the pensions of retired teachers. She has been a problem solver, helping retired teachers work their way through the Health Insurance system. As GBRTA's chairman of the Health Insurance Committee she has been our "go to" person when questions about our Health Insurance or Pensions arose.

While Roz remains enthusiastic about supporting teachers, the retirement of Darlene Perez, her good friend and Administrator of the TRB, provided an impetus for Roz's retirement. She simply did not look forward to breaking in another TRB Administrator.

There is no doubt that Roz will continue to be our advocate—even without making that long drive to Hartford!
